President

Exxon Chemical Company

H. Eugene McBrayer is president of Exxon Chemical Company in Darien, Connecticut and is also a vice president of Exxon Corporation. Exxon Chemical is responsible for Exxon's worldwide chemical business.

Mr. McBrayer began his association with the Exxon organization in 1953 as a student employee at the company's Baton Rouge, Louisiana refinery. He returned to the Baton Rouge refinery after graduation in 1954, holding a series of technical, supervisory and administrative positions, including head of the technical division.

In 1964, Mr. McBrayer transferred to the New York headquarters of the parent company as assistant manager of the New Investments Department. The following year he was named president of the newly established Exxon Enterprises. He also became chief executive of Exxon Nuclear Company in 1977. Mr. McBrayer became executive vice president of Exxon Chemical in 1979 and assumed his present position March 1, 1986.

A native of Birmingham, Alabama, Mr. McBrayer holds a B.S. degree in chemical engineering from Vanderbilt University.

He is vice chairman of the board of directors, U.S. Chemical Manufacturers Association and a member of its executive committee. He is also a director of Clean Sites, Inc. and the World Wildlife Fund—U.S. as well as a member of the AIChE, ACS, and the Society of Chemical Industry—American Section. For the last several years Mr. McBrayer has been active as a member of the Committee of Visitors for the Vanderbilt University School of Engineering. He is currently serving as Chairman of that Committee.

Offering year-round sports events, Pittsburgh is proud of its four Superbowl trophies and World Series Titles. The Penguins are skating to the top of the NHL, while local colleges and universities are courting basketball fans.

Recreation

Pittsburgh offers four-season recreation ranging from boating to skiing. Allegheny County features more golf courses per capita than anywhere else in the country.

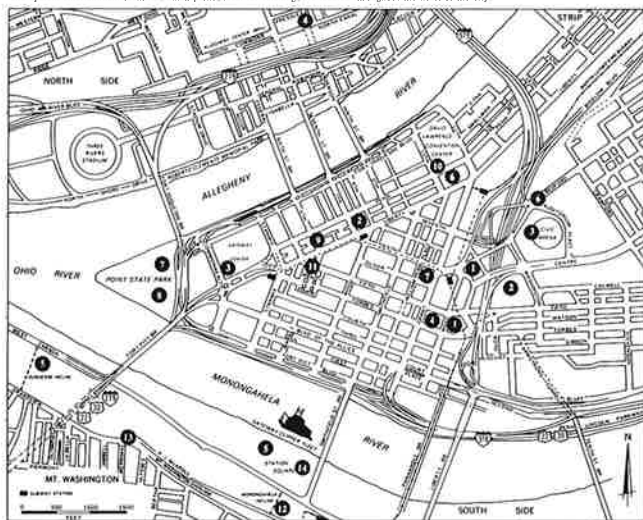
