

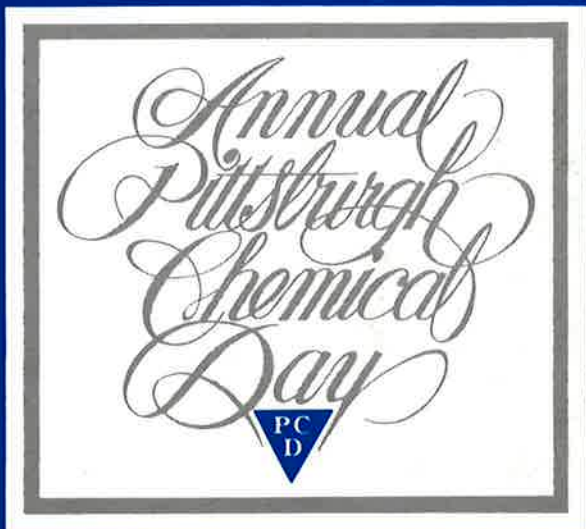

JAMES W. KINNEAR

James W. Kinnear, President and Chief Executive Officer of Texaco Inc., was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on March 21, 1928. He attended St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire, and was graduated with distinction from the United States Naval Academy in 1950 with a bachelor of science degree.

Following service in the Korean War, Kinnear joined Texaco's marketing organization in 1954 and subsequently held sales positions in Puerto Rico, Jamaica, and Hawaii. He became Division Sales Manager in Los Angeles in 1963, and was transferred to New York as Assistant to the Vice Chairman in 1964. In November 1965, he was appointed Assistant to the Chairman and General Manager of the Marine Department.

Kinnear was elected Vice President in charge of Supply and Distribution in 1966. He was elected Senior Vice President for Strategic Planning in 1970. In 1971, he was named Senior Vice President for Worldwide Refining, Petrochemicals, and Supply and Distribution, and in 1972 he became Senior Vice President — Worldwide Marketing, with responsibilities for International Marine and Petrochemicals. In 1976, he was given responsibility for coordinating international marine and aviation sales, the Petrochemical Department, the Marine Department and Marketing and Refining in Europe.

Kinnear was elected a member of Texaco's Board of Directors in July 1977. In October 1978, he was elected Executive Vice President and was named to the Board's Executive Committee.

In March 1982, Kinnear was named President of Texaco U.S.A., located in Houston, Texas. Texaco U.S.A. is involved in all exploration, producing, refining, transportation and marketing in the United States.

In March 1983, he was elected Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors of Texaco Inc. As Vice Chairman, he had executive oversight responsibilities for Texaco U.S.A., as well as for Texaco Chemical Company and for Texaco's interest in Caltex Petroleum Corporation. In January 1985, Kinnear returned to Texaco's executive offices in Harrison, New York.

In October 1986, Kinnear was elected by the Board of Directors to serve as President and Chief Executive Officer of Texaco Inc. effective January 1, 1987.

Kinnear is a member of the Board of Trustees of St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire, and a Director of Corning Incorporated, the American Petroleum Institute and the Metropolitan Opera Association. He is also Chairman and a Director of the Business Council of New York State, a member of The Business Council, a member of the Business Round Table and a member of the National

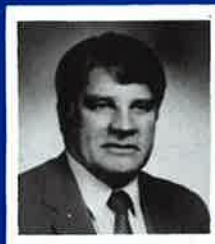

PITTSBURGH

Pittsburgh is situated in Southwestern Pennsylvania in Allegheny County. The city is located within 500 miles of 50 percent of the nation's population.

CLIMATE

With four distinct seasons, Pittsburgh's average temperatures range from a low of 28 degrees in January to a high of 72 degrees in July. The temperate climate creates rich green landscapes in spring and summer, and colorful foliage in autumn.

ECONOMY

Pittsburgh offers a balanced economic base. The progressive economy grew from a once prosperous industrial community to a diverse corporate, medical, financial and educational center.

TRANSPORTATION

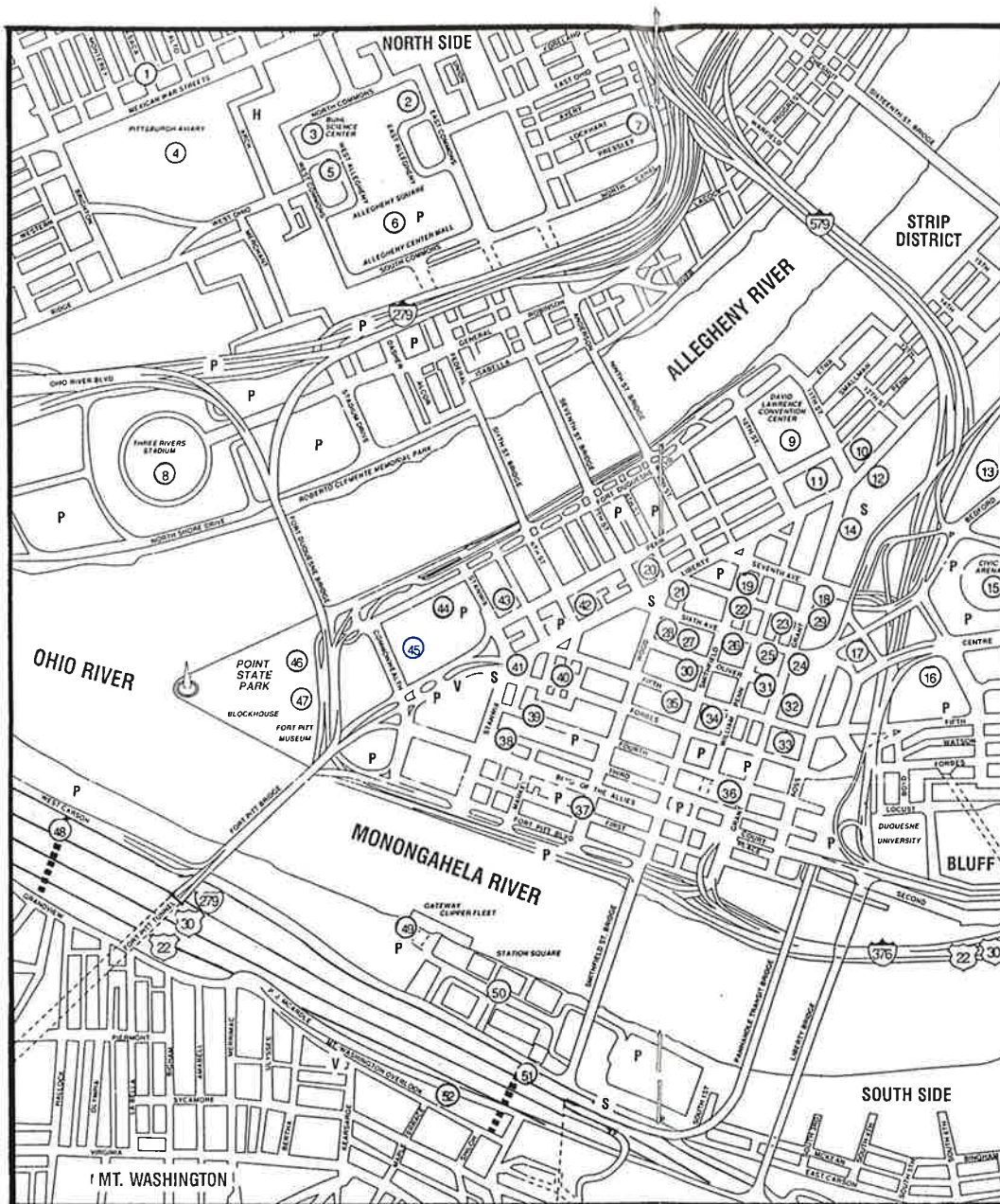
